iMoneyCoach: How to Make Your Own Custom Sign

PRINTABLE INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Decide where the sign is going to go and what it is going to say.
- 2. Pick your background. This could be a board, tray, cupboard, door, wall, etc.
- 3. **Prep your item and gather materials**. Wash your surface and get all of your materials ready. Materials:
 - 1 can of paint
 - 1 can of clear glaze (optional can use a can or spray)
 - 1 sample size paint or a small tube of acrylic paint
 - paint brushes
 - masking tape
 - chalk
 - newspaper (just to keep paint off the kitchen table)
 - 1 metallic silver Sharpie (this is totally optional but a LOT of fun)
- 4. **Print your sign**. You can use a custom font from a site like dafonts.com or a font already on your computer. Make sure the printed size of your words fits the space you are using.
- 5. **Stencil your words**. Follow these steps:
 - a. Cut out each word that you printed in step 4.
 - b. Use chalk to color the back of the words.
 - c. Tape your words where they are going to be on your surface.
 - d. Trace the outline of each letter with a pencil.
- e. Take off the paper one or two words at a time and paint. Since the chalk rubs off, it is best to leave the rest of the words taped on until you are ready.
- 6. **Seal with glaze**. This is optional but a nice touch depending on your intended use for the sign.
